As you enjoy your new product, keep these safety tips in mind

The issue

The home theater entertainment experience is a growing trend, and larger TVs are popular purchases. However, TVs are not always supported on the proper stands or installed according to the manufacturer's recommendations. We and the consumer electronics industry are committed to making home entertainment enjoyable and safe.

TVs that are inappropriately placed on dressers, bookcases, shelves, desks, speakers, chests, or carts may fall over and cause injury.

Tune into safety

- One size of TV stand does **not** fit all. Use only a TV stand rated for the weight of your TV.
- Carefully read and understand all enclosed instructions for proper use of this product.
- Don't let children climb on or play with entertainment system furniture and TVs.
- Don't place TVs on furniture that can easily be used as steps, such as a crate or chest of drawers.
- Remember that children can become excited while watching a program, especially on a "larger-than-life" TV. Make sure that you place or install the TV where it cannot be pushed, pulled over, or knocked down.
- Make sure that you route all cords and cables so that they cannot be pulled or grabbed by curious children.



Wall mounting


If you decide to wall mount your TV, always remember:

- One size of wall mount does **not** fit all. Use only a wall mount rated for the weight of your TV and that has been recommended by this TV manufacturer, listed in this manual, or otherwise listed by an independent laboratory as suitable for your TV.
- Follow all instructions supplied by the TV and wall mount manufacturers.
- If you have any doubts about your ability to safely wall mount your TV, get help from a
 professional installer.
- Make sure that the wall where you are mounting the TV is appropriate. Some wall mounts are not designed to be mounted to walls backed with steel studs or cinder blocks. If you are unsure, ask a professional installer.



TVs can be heavy. At least two people are required for safe wall mount installation.

Important safety instructions







This symbol indicates that dangerous voltage constituting a risk of electric shock is present within your TV. This label is located on the back of your TV.



This symbol indicates that there are important operating and maintenance instructions in the literature accompanying your TV.

- Read these instructions.
- **2** Keep these instructions.
- 3 Heed all warnings.
- 4 Follow all instructions.
- **5** Do not use this apparatus near water.
- **6** Clean only with a dry cloth.
- 7 Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- **8** Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- 9 Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding type plug has two blades and a third grounding prong. The wide blade or the third prong are provided for your safety. If the provided plug does not fit into your outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the obsolete outlet.
- **10** Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the apparatus.
- 11 Only use attachments/accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the apparatus. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart/apparatus combination to avoid injury from tip-over.



- 13 Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
- 14 Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or moisture, does not operate normally, or has been dropped.
- 15 The wall plug is the disconnecting device. The plug must remain readily operable.
- 16 An apparatus with a three-prong, grounding-type plug is a Class I apparatus, which needs to be grounded to prevent possible electric shock. Make sure that you connect this Class I television to a grounding-type, three-prong outlet.
- 17 Remote control batteries should not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire, or the like.

18 The apparatus should not be exposed to dripping or splashing, and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, should be placed on the apparatus.

Warnings

Electric shock hazard

To reduce the risk of fire or electric shock, do not remove any cover or expose the device to rain or moisture. No user-serviceable parts are inside. Refer servicing to qualified service technicians.

Lightning

For added protection for your device receiver during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the power outlet and disconnect any antenna or cable system. This helps prevent property damage and personal injury from lightning and power line surges.

Power lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

Handling the LCD panel

- Your TV's screen is made of glass. Do not drop your TV or hit, jolt, or press hard against the LCD panel. If the screen breaks, be careful of broken glass.
- If the LCD panel is broken, make absolutely sure that you do not touch the liquid in the panel. This may cause skin inflammation.
- If the liquid gets in your mouth, immediately gargle, rinse, and consult with your doctor. Also, if the liquid gets in your eyes or touches your skin, consult with your doctor after rinsing for at least 15 minutes or longer in clean water.

Replacement parts

When replacement parts are required, make sure that the service technician uses replacement parts specified by the manufacturer that have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock, personal injury, or other hazards.

Safety check

After completing any service or repair to this device, ask the service technician to perform routine safety checks to determine that your TV is in correct operating condition.

Power source

Operate your TV only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supplied to your home, consult an electrician or your local power company.

Cautions

Damage requiring service


Unplug this TV from the power outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

- When the power supply cord or plug is damaged or frayed.
- If liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into your TV.
- If your TV has been exposed to rain or water.

- If your TV does not operate normally by following the operating
 instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the
 operating instructions because incorrect adjustment of other
 controls may result in damage and will often require extensive
 work by a qualified technician to restore your TV to its normal
 operation.
- If your TV has been dropped or damaged in any way.
- When your TV exhibits a distinct change in performance.

Outdoor antenna grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to your TV, make sure that the antenna or cable system is grounded to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 70, provides information with respect to correct grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of the antenna-discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.

Note to CATV system installer

Article 820 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA No. 40 provides guidance for correct grounding. Specifically, it states that the cable ground must be connected to the grounding system of the building as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

Condensation

Moisture will form on the TV if the TV is brought from cool surroundings into a warm room or if the temperature of the room rises suddenly. When this happens, the TV's performance may be impaired. To prevent this, let the TV stand in its new surroundings for about an hour before switching it on, or make sure that the room temperature rises gradually.

Condensation may also form during the summer if the TV is exposed to the breeze from an air conditioner. In such cases, change the location of the TV.

Mobile telephone warning

To avoid interference with your TV picture and sound, operating problems, or even damage, keep your cordless and cellular telephones away from the TV.

End of life directives

Your TV contains tin-lead solder and a fluorescent lamp containing a small amount of mercury. Disposal of these materials may be regulated for environmental reasons. Your TV also contains material that can be recycled and reused. For disposal or recycling information, contact your local authorities or the Electronic Industries Alliance at www.eia.org to find a recycler in your area.

Non-active pixels

The LCD panel contains almost 3 million thin film transistors, which provide exceptionally sharp video quality. Occasionally, a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed blue, green, or red point. These non-active pixels do not adversely affect the performance of your TV, and are not considered defects.

Installing and removing the stand

You must install your TV into the stand in order for it to stand upright on a cabinet or other flat surface. If you intend to mount your TV on a wall or other vertical surface, you must remove the stand column.

Cautions

- Read these instructions carefully before you try to assemble the stand or remove the stand column.
- Make sure that you handle the TV carefully when attempting to assemble or remove the stand. If you are not sure of your ability to do this, contact a professional installer or service technician. Dynex is not responsible for any damages or injuries that occur because of mishandling or incorrect assembly.
- Use a soft cushion or covering to prevent scratching or damage to the TV screen or cabinet.
- The speaker is not intended to support the weight of the TV. Do not move or handle the TV by the speaker. This can cause damage that is not covered by your warranty.
- Before assembly or removal of the stand, unplug the power cord.

Installing the stand




To install the stand:

1 Remove the stand from the box.

Note: The wide portion of the stand should face the front of the TV

- **2** Lay the TV (screen down) on a flat, cushioned surface.
- 3 Align the stand with the TV, as shown in the following illustration.






- 4 Move the stand gently until the locating ridges on the stand column align with the locating grooves on the stand.
- **5** Align the holes in the stand with the holes in the stand column, then secure the stand to the column with the four M5 screws provided.

To remove the stand, loosen the four screws.

Installing a wall-mount bracket

To install a wall-mount bracket:

- 1 Lay your TV face down on a table or bench. Make sure that you put down a soft cushion or cloth so that your TV is not scratched.
- **2** Remove the four screws that secure the TV to the base.
- 3 Remove the four screws holding the stand column to the TV, then remove the stand column.



Note: The appearance of the TVs in these illustrations may differ from your actual TV and are for instructional purposes only.

4 Secure the wall-mount bracket to the back of your TV using the four M6 screws provided with the bracket.



Using the remote control

Installing remote control batteries

To install remote control batteries:

 Press down on the battery compartment cover lock, then remove the remote control cover.



- Insert two AAA batteries into the battery compartment. Make sure that the + and - symbols on the batteries match the + and - symbols in the battery compartment.
- **3** Replace the cover. Make sure that the lock snaps into place.


Battery precautions:

- Dispose of batteries as hazardous waste.
- Do not mix batteries of different types.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries and can cause old batteries to leak.
- Remove batteries as soon as they become inoperable. Chemicals that can leak from the batteries can cause a rash. If the batteries leak, clean the battery compartment with a cloth.
- If the remote control is not used for an extended period of time, remove the batteries.
- Do not expose batteries to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire, or other heat sources.

Aiming the remote control

To aim the remote control:

 Point the remote control towards the remote sensor on the front of your TV.



Notes:

- Do not expose the remote control to shock or liquids.
- Do not use the remote control in an area with high humidity.

- Do not place the remote control in direct sunlight.
- Do not place objects, such as furniture, between the remote control and the remote sensor.
- The remote control may not work if direct sunlight or bright light shines on the remote sensor. Either move your TV or change the angle at which you use the remote control.

Tips:

- The brand name is often visible on the front of the universal remote control, and the model number is often visible on the back.
- The codes shown above are common codes, but are subject to change. Please refer to Dynexproducts.com for the most up to date codes.
- If your universal remote control isn't listed on the chart, refer to your universal remote control's instructions and try codes for the brands Orion, Emerson, Memorex, Sansui, Sylvania, or Zenith. You may need to try several codes before finding a match.
- 2 Follow your universal remote control's instructions to enter the code you found in Step 1.

Tips:

- If your universal remote control has a code search feature, run a code search to identify a code that matches your TV. See your universal remote control's instructions for details.
- If your universal remote control has a "learn" feature, you can manually program it using your TV remote to "teach" the commands one at a time. See your universal remote control's instructions for details.
- 3 If all else fails, you must use a different universal remote control that can operate both your set-top box and your TV. Five such remotes are listed on the chart, but many other compatible models are available in the market.

Making connections

Before you make any connections:

- Check the plugs on the ends of cables to make sure that they are the correct type before you try plugging them into jacks on the TV
- Make sure that all plugs are securely inserted into the jacks.
 Loose connections can result in image or color problems.
- When connecting devices to the TV, make sure that the TV and the device are turned off and that the power cords are unplugged.

Selecting a location

You should select a location for the TV:


- Where direct light does not reflect on the screen
- That has indirect and soft lighting
- Where the TV has access to an antenna or cable TV connection
- Where the TV has access to a power outlet

Note: Watching TV in total darkness or with a reflection on the screen may cause eye strain.

Connecting the power

To connect the power cord:

 Connect the power cable to the AC IN jack on the back of the TV, then connect the other end to a power outlet.



Notes:


- The AC plug on the TV may be different from the one shown.
- Make sure that you only use the type of power source indicated on the marking label.
- Always unplug the power cord when not using the TV for a long period of time.

Connecting an HDMI device

Note: If your device has an HDMI connection, we recommend you use that to get the best quality possible.

To connect an HDMI device:

Connect one end of an HDMI cable (not included) to the HDMI 1
or HDMI2 jack on the back of your TV, or HDMI3 jack on the side
of your TV, then connect the other end of the cable to the HDMI
OUT jack on the HDMI device.



Note: To connect a DVI device, use a DVI to HDMI adapter cable to connect to the **HDMI** jack on the TV, then connect an audio cable to the **PC IN AUDIO** jack on the back of the TV.

To play from the HDMI device:

- Turn on the TV, then press INPUT. The INPUT SOURCE menu opens.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select HDMI 1, HDMI 2, or HDMI3, then press ENTER.

Note: You can also press **HDMI** once to select **HDMI 1**, twice to select **HDMI 2**, or three times to select **HDMI3**.


3 Turn on the HDMI device, then set it to the correct mode. Refer to the instructions that came with the HDMI device.

Connecting a component video device

Component cables often have red, green, and blue color-coded video connectors and red and white audio connectors. Match the colors when making connections.

To connect a component video device:

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the component video device is turned off.
- 2 Connect a component video cable to the COMPONENT OUT jacks on the component video device.

- 3 Connect the other end of the component video cable to the COMPONENT1 or COMPONENT2 jacks on the back of your TV.
- **4** Connect an audio cable (not included) to the **AUDIO OUT** jacks (L/R) on the component device.
- 5 Connect the other end of the audio cable to the COMPONENT1 or COMPONENT2 AUDIO-R and AUDIO-L jacks on the back of your TV.

To play from the component video device:

- Turn on the TV, then press INPUT. The INPUT SOURCE menu opens.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to select Component1 or Component2, then press ENTER.


Note: You can also press **COMP** once to select **Component1** or twice to select **Component2**.

3 Turn on the component video device and start playback. Refer to the instructions that came with the component video device.

Connecting an antenna, cable TV, or satellite TV box

To connect an antenna, cable TV, or satellite TV box:

 Connect one end of a 75-Ohm, coaxial cable to the ANT/CABLE IN jack on the back of the TV, then connect the other end of the cable to the antenna or cable TV wall jack.



- If you are connecting a satellite TV or cable box, you can use one of the following (if available):
 - Acceptable 75-ohm coaxial cable.
 - Good Video composite cable
 - Better S-Video cable
 - Better Video component cables
 - Best HDMI cable

Notes:

- We recommend using a 75-0hm, coaxial cable to reduce interference and noise that may be caused by radio wave transmissions.
- Do not bundle the coaxial cable with the power cord or any other cables
- If you are using an antenna and reception is not good, contact a service technician to adjust the antenna.

Connecting a VCR


Note: If the VCR has an S-Video jack (good), component jacks (better), or an HDMI jack (best), connect the VCR using the best available connection.

To connect a VCR:

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the VCR is turned off
- 2 Connect one end of a standard AV cable (not included) into the AV1 IN VIDEO jack on the back of the TV, then connect the other end of the cable to the AV OUT VIDEO jack on the VCR.

-0R-

For a better picture, you can connect an S-Video cable to the **S-VIDEO OUT** jack on the VCR and the **S-VIDEO1** jack on your TV.



Note: Cable connectors and jacks are often color-coded. Match the colors when you connect the AV cable.

3 Connect the audio connectors of the AV cable (the red and white connectors) to the AV OUT AUDIO jacks of the VCR, then connect them to the AV1 IN AUDIO-L and AUDIO-R jacks on the back of your TV.

To play the VCR:


- 1 Turn on the TV, then press INPUT. The INPUT SOURCE menu opens.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to select AV1 or S-Video1, then press ENTER.
 Note: You can also press VIDEO once to select AV1 or three times for S-Video1.

Connecting a camcorder or game console

Note: If your game console has an HDMI connection, you will get better quality using the HDMI connection instead of the AV connection.

To connect a camcorder or game console:

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the camcorder or game console is turned off.
- 2 Connect one end of a standard AV cable (not included) into the AV2 IN VIDEO jack on the side of the TV, then connect the other end of the cable to the AV OUT VIDEO jack on the camcorder or game console.



Note: Cable connectors and jacks are often color-coded. Match the colors when you connect the AV cable.

3 Connect the audio connectors of the AV cable (the red and white connectors) to the AV OUT AUDIO jacks of the camcorder or game console, then connect them to the AV2 IN AUDIO-L and AUDIO-R jacks on the side of your TV.


To playback the camcorder or play the game console:

- 1 Turn on the TV, then press INPUT. The INPUT SOURCE menu opens.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to select AV2, then press ENTER.
 Note: You can also press VIDEO twice to select AV2.
- **3** Turn on the camcorder or game console, then follow the instructions that came with the device to play from the camcorder or game console.

Connecting a computer

To connect a computer:

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the computer is turned off.
- 2 Connect one end of a VGA cable (not included) to the PC IN VGA jack on the back of the TV, then connect the other end of the cable to the VGA jack on the computer.



3 Connect one end of an audio cable (not included) to the **PC IN AUDIO** jack on the back of the TV, then connect the other end of the cable to the **AUDIO OUT** jack on the computer.

Note: The audio cable should have a stereo mini-plug.

To play video from the computer:


- Turn on the TV, then press INPUT. The INPUT SOURCE menu opens.
- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to select VGA, then press ENTER.
 Tip: You can also press the VGA button on the remote for VGA.
- 3 Turn on the computer, then adjust the computer display properties as needed.

Connecting a home theater system

Connecting using an analog audio cable

To connect using an analog audio cable:

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the audio amplifier is turned off.
- 2 Connect one end of a audio cable (not included) to the AUDIO OUT jacks (L&R) on the back of the TV.




Note: Cable connectors and jacks are often color-coded. Match the colors when you connect the AV cable.

3 Connect the other end of the audio cable to the **AUDIO IN** jacks on the home theater system.

Connecting using a digital audio cable

To connect using a digital optical cable:

- 1 Make sure that your TV's power cord is unplugged and the digital audio system is turned off.
- 2 Connect one end of a digital optical audio cable (not included) to the DIGITAL OUTPUT jack on the back of the TV.



3 Connect the other end of the audio cable to the digital optical input jack on the digital audio system.

Note: The **DIGITAL OUTPUT** jack only works with digital TV channels.

To play TV sound through a home theater system:

- **1** Turn on the TV and select a program to watch.
- 2 Turn on the home theater system and select the TV sound source, then adjust the volume to a comfortable level.

Connecting headphones

Warning: When using headphones, adjust the headphone volume to avoid excessively loud volume which can damage your hearing.

To connect headphones:



Turning on your TV for the first time

To configure your TV:

- 1 Make sure that you have inserted the batteries in the remote control, connected your devices to the TV, and connected the AC power.
- 2 Press (Power), then wait several seconds. The initial *Setup Wizard* screen opens (only the first time you turn on your TV).



3 Press ▲ or ▼ to select the menu language you want, then press ENTER. The Time screen opens.



- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Time Zone, then press ⋖ or ► to select your time zone. You can select Pacific, Alaska, Hawaii, Atlantic, Eastern, Central, or Mountain.
- 5 If your viewing area observes daylight savings time, press ▲ or ▼ to highlight **DST**, then press ◀ or ▶ to select **On**.

- **6** Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight **Mode**, then press ⋖ or ► to select **Manual** (to set the date/time manually), or **Auto** (the date/time are automatically set by the TV signal source, based on the time zone you selected).
- 7 If you select **Manual** mode, make the settings as follows:
 - Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Year, Month, or Day, then press
 or ► to adjust the setting.
 - Set the time by pressing ▲ or ▼ to highlight **Time**, then press ◀ or ► to highlight the hour, minute, or AM/PM field.
 Press ▲ or ▼ to adjust the setting.
- **8** Press **ENTER**. The *Choose your Picture Mode* screen opens.




9 Press ▲ or ▼ to select Home Mode or Retail Mode, then press ENTER.

If you select **Home Mode**, the *Choose your TV source* screen opens.

If you select **Retail Mode**, a message stating "Are you sure you want Retail mode? Since in this mode Energy saving is not realized." appears. Select **Yes** to proceed, or No to exit.



- **10** Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Antenna**, **Cable**, or **Cable/Satellite Box**, depending on the type of connection you have.
 - If you are using an antenna for a standard or HD TV signal, select Antenna.
 - If your cable is connected directly to the TV (without a tuner box), select Cable.
 - If your cable is connected to your TV through a tuner box, select Cable/Satellite Box.
- **11** Press ► when you have made your selection. The channel scan screen opens.

If you selected **Antenna** or **Cable**, your TV automatically scans for available channels in your area and stores the channel information in the channel list. This may take several minutes. While scanning, the TV displays a progress report.

- OR -

If you selected **Cable/Satellite Box**, the auto scan is not necessary and the screen will ask you to select the correct input source for your set top box. Press **EXIT** to close the menu.

Notes:

- During auto scan, digital programs will be scanned first, then analog
 programs. When all available digital programs have been searched,
 the screen will ask you to "Press MENU or EXIT if you don't need
 analog channel scan." At this point you can press EXIT to exit the
 analog channel scan, or just ignore it and the TV will go on scanning.
- Channel scan can take up to 30+ minutes.
- You can press **EXIT** at any time to stop the auto scan, but you will need to run the auto scan again to create a channel list.
- **12** Select the corresponding video input source through the *INPUT SOURCE* menu.

Understanding the basics

Turning your TV on or off

To turn your TV on or off (standby mode):

- 1 Plug the power cord into an AC power outlet.
- **2** Press ♂ (power). Your TV turns on.
- 3 Press \circlearrowleft again to turn off your TV. When you turn off your TV, it goes into standby mode.


Warning: When your TV is in standby mode, it is still receiving power. To completely disconnect power, unplug the power cord.

Note: If your TV does not receive an input signal for several minutes, it automatically goes into standby mode.

Selecting the video input source

To select the video input source:

1 Turn on your TV, then press the **INPUT** key on the remote, or the INPUT button on the TV. The *INPUT SOURCE* menu opens.



- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight the video source, then press ENTER.

 You can also select the input source using the following remote control buttons:
 - COMP—Press repeatedly to cycle between Component inputs.
 - **HDMI**—Press repeatedly to cycle between **HDMI** inputs.
 - VIDEO—Press repeatedly to cycle between AV and S-Video inputs
 - TV—Press to switch to TV mode.
 - **VGA**—Press to view a computer connected to your TV.

Selecting a channel

To select a channel:

- Press CH ∧ / CH ∨ to go to the next or previous channel.
- Press the number buttons to enter the channel number you
 want, then wait for the channel to change, or press ENTER to
 change the channel immediately.
 - To select a digital channel, press the number buttons to select the main digital channel, then press the dot (.) button, then the number buttons again to select the sub-channel.
 Wait for the channel to change or press ENTER to change the channel.

Note: Button presses must be within three seconds of each other.

- Press **RECALL** to go to the last channel viewed.
- Press CH-LIST to display a list of memorized channels, press ▲ or
 ▼ to select the channel you want from the list, then press ENTER
 to go to that channel.
- Press FAVORITE to display a list of your saved favorite channels, press ▲ or ▼ to select the channel you want from the list, then press ENTER to go to that channel.

Note: If the list has more than one page, press ◀ or ▶ to scroll through the pages.

Adjusting the volume

To adjust the volume:

- Press **VOL**+ or **VOL** to increase or decrease the volume.
- Press MUTE to temporarily turn off all sound. Press MUTE again to restore the sound.


Displaying program information

To display program information:

- Press INFO to show an information banner. The information banner shows current program information such as channel number, video input source, and resolution.
 - Digital signal information—Displays channel number, station name, channel label (if preset), broadcast program name, TV rating, signal type, audio information, resolution, CC mode, current time, and current program start and end times when watching a digital channel.
 - Analog signal information—Displays channel number, channel label (if preset), signal type, audio information, and resolution when watching an analog channel.
- Press GUIDE to show the digital program guide, which may show a list of available programs, program times, and program summaries, depending on the information provided by the broadcaster.



 - VGA Settings—Lets you adjust picture settings to optimize a computer display. (This menu becomes available only when a computer display is connected to the television.)
 - Input Label Create a unique name for a device connected to your TV's input jacks.
 - **Restore Default**—Reset most TV settings for the current source to factory default values.
 - Audio Only—Turn off the TV picture and listen to audio
- 4 Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

Adjusting the picture

Adjusting the TV picture

To adjust the picture:

1 Press **MENU**. The on-screen menu opens with the *Picture* menu displayed.



- 2 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight an option, then press ◄ or ► to adjust the option. You can select:
 - **Picture Mode**—Selects the picture mode. You can select:
 - Vivid (a bright and vivid picture)
 - **Standard** (a standard picture)
 - **Sports** (a dynamic picture)
 - **Theater** (a finely detailed picture)
 - Energy Saving (the backlight brightness is decreased)
 - Custom (customized picture).

- **Contrast**—Adjusts the contrast.

- **Tint**—Adjusts the image tint.

 Backlight Adjusts the screen backlight.
- 3 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight Advanced Video, then press ENTER to enter the sub-menu.

- 4 Press ▲ or ▼ to highlight an option, then press ◄ or ▶ to adjust the option. You can select:
 - Color Temperature Selects the color temperature. You can select **Warm** (to enhance the reds), **Cool** (to enhance the blues), or Normal.
 - **Zoom Mode** Selects the aspect ratio of the picture. You can select:
 - Auto (selects the correct aspect ratio automatically. Available only when Auto Zoom is turned ON).
 - Normal (selects the correct aspect ratio to match the source image).
 - **Wide** (shows a full-screen picture).
 - **Zoom** (enlarges the picture but may crop the top and
 - **Cinema** (stretches the picture at the edges, but maintains a good aspect ratio at the center of the screen).


Note: The above aspect ratios are all available only when **Overscan** is turned **ON** when watching a digital program.

- Noise Reduction—Selects the noise reduction mode to reduce picture noise (snow). You can select Weak, Middle, Strong, or Off.
- Overscan—Turn this On to adjust the picture's reproduction rate.
- Adaptive Contrast—Turn this On to optimize the picture display for a more vivid image.
- **DCR**—Turn this **On** to activate the Dynamic Backlight Control function. Depending on the signal, the TV automatically adjusts the backlight level, which affects the overall brilliance of the picture.
- Auto Zoom—In TV mode, setting Auto Zoom to On lets you set the Zoom Mode to Auto.
- 5 Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu, or press **EXIT** to close the menu.

Checking digital TV signal strength


You can check the signal strength of digital channels to determine if you need to adjust your antenna or digital cable input. The higher the signal strength, the less likely you are to experience picture degradation.


Setting parental controls

Parental controls let you prevent your children from watching inappropriate material on TV. When set, parental controls read the rating of the program (with some exceptions, such as news and sports) and deny access to programs that exceed the ratings level you select.
